


1 Agnarr Skulason - new device

Herald of Record: Duncan von Halstern

Quarterly gules and sable, in sinister chief two swords and in dexter base, a drinking horn all argent.

This will be returned for appearance of marshalling.

[Name registered August 1998, via the East]






2 Alastair Corum (m) - new primary name & new device Herald of Record: Tanczos Istvan

Heraid of Record: Tanczos Istvan

Quarterly gules and sable, in pale a jawless skull and a pair of cutlasses in saltire argent.

Alasdair from Black, p14, "The Gaelic form of Alexander."

No docs supplied for Corum. If it can not be dated, the submitter will accept "Corran" from Tangwystl's "Manx names in the Early 16th Century." (http://www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/jonesmanx16.html)




3 Aldrich von Bremen - resub at kingdom device

Herald of Record: Marcus Blackaert

Quarterly Or and sable, in the first a saltire gules, in the fourth a bear rampant sable.

This will be returned for appearance of marshalling. Previous submission 'Or, a bear rampant sable within a bordure gules.' returned from 2002-02 for conflict. Previous submission 'Vert a bear's head erased Or.' returned from 2000-01 for conflict.


4 Alise Whenby - resub at kingdom device

Herald of Record: Aine Callaghan

Argent, a chevron wavy purpure between two fir trees and a tower vert.

Previous submission 'Argent, a chevron purpure between two fir trees and a tower vert.' returned at kingdom for conflict from 2002-Sept ILoI

[Name was on the East's September 2002 LoI, accepted at Kingdom in November 2002. It has not yet reached Laurel]



5 Ann of Thanet (f) - new primary name & new device

Herald of Record: Evan da Collaureo


Per pale gules and argent, on a pair of wings counterchanged, a trillium proper.

[What color is proper for a trillium? The last Laurel ruling I find on this is the following: "These are the stylized trilliums used by Ontario, and hence they are blazoned piecewise, rather than as proper. This way no genus and species are needed. WVS [5] [LoAR 24 Oct 79], p. 10". The trilliums in that submission are blazoned 'argent seeded Or, barbed vert'. This trillium is purpure, leaved vert.]

Sound most important.

Ann from Withycombe, says '1218 is the earliest record of this name in England', cites Anne of Bohemia, Queen of Richard II.

Thanet from Mills' <u>Dictionary of English Place Names</u> s.n. Thanet, gives 'Tanet' from Domesday book. This is the modernized spelling.



Herald of Record: Avelina Keyes Submitted Name: *Lockwood Manor*

Sable, a chevron between three padlocks Or.

Ekwall, p302, lists Loc(k)wode, 1275 and Locwode, 1297.

No documentation is provided for the construction as a valid household name.

7 Batujin Nasan (f) - new primary name & new device


Herald of Record: Harold von Auerbach


Azure, four bowen knots (lozengy-wise) in pall within a bordure Or.


Name constructed from 'On the Documentation and Construction of Period Mongolian Names' (http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/baras-aghur/mongolian.html)

Batujin composed of 'Batu' 'loyal' and 'jin' 'of'.

Nasan means 'life'.







8 Bella Delmare (f) - new primary name

Herald of Record: Robin Gallowglass

No major changes.



9 Brannat Dubh - new device change

Herald of Record:

Azure, on the crossbar of a tau cross throughout between two mullets argent, a rose gules between thre ravens sable.

[Name registered August 1996, via the East, as Brannat Dub]



10 Branwen d'an ivineg (f) - new primary name & new device Herald of Record:

Per chevron inverted azure and purpure, a crow volant wings down and a yew all within a bordure argent.

No changes.

Docs from Robert-Jacques Thibaud's Dictionnaire de Mythologie et de Symbolique Celte ('Dictionary of Celtic Mythology and Symbology').

Branwen a celtic name meanining 'White Crow'.

D'an ivineg from Brittany meaning 'where yew are growing'.

[This is not acceptable documentation. Please help.]


11 Calum O'Moraín (m) - new name


Herald of Record: Robin Gallowglass

No major changes. Sound most important.

Calum from Black, p 127, s.n. Callum. Also in Peadar Morgan's 'Scottish Gaelic Names for Children', listed as a variation on St. Columba.

[There appears to be no documentation for the surname. Please help.]





12 Cristina Donatini (f) - new primary name

Herald of Record: Robin Gallowglass

No major changes. Sound, language/culture: Northern Italian most important.

Cristina from De Felice's *nomi*, p 117, dated to 1485.

Donatini from "Feminine Given Names From The Online Catasto of Florence of 1427." (http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/arval/catasto)


13 Diomedes Sebastianus - new device change

Herald of Record: Aine Callaghan

Vert, an eagle displayed perched upon a crescent inverted and a dexter tierce argent.

Previous device to become badge.

[Name on the December 7, 2002 Eastern Internal Letter of Intent, has not yet passed Kingdom]




14 Einar Ulfson - resub device

Herald of Record: Aine Callaghan

Sable, a schnecke issuant from sinister chief Or.

[Name registered June 2000, via the East]



15 Eleanor fitzPatrick - new badge

Herald of Record: Tibor of Rock Valley

Argent, a horse passant and a bordure embattled gules.

[Name registered September 1995, via the East]




16 Ernst Nuss von Kitzingen - new device

Herald of Record: Tanczos Istvan

Gules, a chalice Or and in chief a pair of hands argent.

[Name Registered September 1995, via the East]



17 Fief des Sylves Constellées - new branch name & new device Herald of Record:

Or, three pine trees fitched vert and on a chief dancetty a laurel wreath between two mullets Or.

All docs from 'Le Petit Larousse Ilustré Dictionnarire, Édition 1994.


Sylve from the latin 'sylva' meaning 'forest'.

Constellées derived from constellation from the latin 'stella' meaning 'star'.

No documention provided that this fits period naming practices for locations.

Petition attached, signed by four of the five members of the group, has both the proposed name and a black-and-white emblazon, and is therefore acceptable.

['Fief' is apparently meant to be the group designator. It is not a standard designator from Appendix B of the Admin Handbook.]



18 Francesco Gaetano Greco de Edessa - new primary name change

Current name: Francesco Gaetano Greco da Foresta Orientale

Edessa was a crusader state which fell to Zenghi in 1143 CE. From Donald Matthew's <u>Atlas of Medieval</u> <u>Europe</u> p 91.

Remainder of name is grandfathered to submitter.


[OOPS! I goofed! This was on the last LoI under his current society name (Francesco Gaetano Greco da Foresta Orientale) The current name was registered in August 1998, via the East]

19 Gabriel of Maccuswell - new device

Herald of Record: Ariel de Narbonne

Per bend sinister argent and sable, a winged trumpet counterchanged all within a bordure embattled vert.

[Name registered March 2001, via the East]




20 Gerrard Sanglier - resub device

Herald of Record: Margaret Holmwood

Potent, on a chief vert a boar passant argent.

[Previous device 'Per fess vert and potent, a boar passant argent.' returned for conflict. Name was accepted at Kingdom in July 2002, it should appear at Laurel on the East's 23 January 2003 xLoI]




21 Giuseppina Sciarrino - new device

Herald of Record: Ariel de Narbonne

Per bend sinister sable and gules, a bend sinister rayonny between a billet fesswise Or surmounted by a shoe gules and a lion rampant guardant Or.

[Name accepted on the East's 2002 September LoI]



22 Hiyama no Oniko - new primary name & new badge

Herald of Record: Margaret Holmwood

Azure, three wolves teeth issuant from base and in dexter chief a roundel argent.


Submitter desires meaning and Japanese language/culture 1000 AD. Requests authenticity for Japanese. None of the listed sources are matched to the documentation they provide.

Hiyama is a surname, 'territory of sw tip of Hokkaido.

No is 'of'.

Oniko is compound name formed of elements 'oni' meaning goblin and 'ko' meaning 'child'.

Sources are CA#65 'A Japanese Miscellany'. 'Japanese Names for Babies' by Aiko Nishi Uwate, and 'Japan, a Bilingual Atlas' by Kodansha International.



Per fess embattled sable and vert, a demi-sun issuant from the line of division Or and an open book argent.

Justina from Withycombe, p185, cites a 4th Century martyr and saint by this name. Patron saint of Padua. 'Justine' and 'Giustina' were current in France and England. De Felice's *nomi* lists Giustino (Giustina) martyred in 165.

Elisabétta from De Felice's *nomi*, p141, undated, lists 92,000 of them.

Vigilanté from Morlet Vol 2, p116 and Fucilla p68. 'Vigilante', undated.


24 Konrad von Schwendi (m) - new name


Herald of Record: Robin Gallowglass

No major changes. Meaning most important: 'Konrad from Schwendi'.

Konrad from Gwynek's "Late Period Masculine German Names" (http://www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/germmasc.html).

Schwendi from Brechenmacher, p 585, s.n. Schwend, 1206.





25 Lenairt Melcior Harmans (m) - new primary name

Herald of Record: Ariel de Narbonne

no major changes. Sound, language/culture: low countries (Dutch) most important.

Lenairt (more important, if you must drop one, retain this one) from Aryanhwy's '15th Century Dutch Names' (http://www.sit.wisc.edu/~sfriedmann/names/dutch15.htm) as a variation of Leenaert that occurred from 1478-81

Melcior from same, 1478-81.

Harmans from same, listed as a variant of 'Herman' from 1518, 1531-32.

Also "Dutch Names" (http://home.earthlink.net/~gverver/dnc.htm) shows how patronymics were attached to form patronymics prior to 1796 in Dutch - add an 's'.

If this is not exactly correct, the Surnames section of Aryanhwy's article (http://www.sit.wisc.edu/~sfriedemann/names/dutch15surnames.htm) lists 'Harmansz' and 'Harmanssoen' as surnames based on Harman. Either acceptable if the name must be changed, former preferred.

26 Lilias de Cheryngton - resub device

Herald of Record: Margaret Holmwood

Vert, a crequier within a bordure embattled argent.

Previous device 'vert, a crequier argent' returned for conflict.

[Name registered December 2001, via the East]

27 Mariette de Bretagne (f) - new primary name & new device


Herald of Record: Tanczos Istvan

Quarterly azure and sable, a butterfly between five annulets palewise in annulo argent.

Sound, language/culture: late period french most important.

Mariette from Dauzat, p416, undated. Gwynek's "Late period feminine names form the south of France" gives a Marette (1528) and a Marieta (1521), so this seems a plausible spelling.

De Bretagne from Dauzat, p66, undated.



28 Natalía Karaulova (f) - new primary name & new device

Herald of Record: Aine Callaghan


Vert, a chevron Or between three suns in their splendor argent, charged with a bat displayed sable.

No major changes. Sound most important. 15th C. Russian.

Docs from the online Wickenden (http://www.sca.org/heraldry/paul/index.html). Natalía a 'natural' russianization of Natalie. Shows Natalía, wife of Andrei, died 1371.

Karaulova from same, Karaula lists a 'Karaul Trukhin in 790. [MOR98], gives patronymic Karaulov (Cheremisin Karaulov) in 1461 [TUP 423]. The patronymic has been feminized.

[The device is actually 'Vert, on a chevron Or between three suns in splendor argent a reremouse displayed sable']




29 Oksana Goncharova - new device

Herald of Record: Alistrina de Mann

Per pale azure and Or, a garb counterchanged.

[Name registered June 1993, via the East]




30 Olrik van Lubbeke - new badge

Herald of Record: Tanczos Istvan

Per pale wavy azure and or, in pale three hounds courant counterchanged.

[Name was registered in September 2002, via the East]




31 Robin Gallowglass - new badge

Herald of Record: Robin Gallowglass

(Fieldless) a hand apaumy argent charged with the letters 'He' gules.

[Name registered May 1993, via the East]



32 Ronald le Surde (m) - new primary name

Herald of Record: Kat'ryna Neblaga Volchkova

Ronald dated to 1511 in that spelling in R&W, s.n. 'Ronaldson'.

33 Sonja Ryzaja - new primary name & new device


Herald of Record: Ariel de Narbonne

Per pale sable and vert, a panther salient contourny incense argent spotted sable within an orle argent.

No changes except as listed. Meaning language/culture most important. The cyrillic for this name is "Соня Рыжая". Using the international phonetic system of transliteration gives the submitted spelling.

Sonja from Wickenden (<u>http://www.sca.org/heraldry/paul/si.html</u>) - no date given on submission paperwork.

Ryzaja means 'red haired' in Russian -- this is the feminine form. (Attestation from Predslava attached, with headers). If an all-masculine form is required to go with the masculine 'Sonja', the submitter will accept 'Ryzii'.




34 Susanna Lockheart - new device

Herald of Record: Avraham Harofeh

Sable, on a bend bwtween two hearts argent, three fetterlocks palewise purpure.

[Name is on the December 2002 Eastern Internal LoI]
