

**1 Aldrich von Bremen** - resub device Herald of Record: Marcus Blackaert

Or, between a saltire gules four bears rampant sable.

The name was registered by Laurel in 11/01.

Previous device (*Or*, *a bear rampant sable within a bordure gules*.) returned on the East's 2002-02 letter for conflict with Francesca Petrarcha, commonly known as Petrarch (*Or*, *a bear rampant sable holding in its forepaws three apples gules*). His original device submission, (*Vert, a bear's head erased Or*) on East's 2000-01 IIoI was returned for conflict with both Roger FitzRolf Le Normand (*Quarterly gules and checky sable and argent, a bear's head erased Or*) and Ursula Messerschmitt (*Vert, a bear's head cabossed argent*).





**2 Alessandra de Burgos** (F) - new name & new device Herald of Record: Sancha de Flores

Azure, a chevron between two lilies and a castle argent.

Submitter desires authenticity for 'Spanish/Italian culture', and wishes to retain the sound as well. She would like a Spanish name that 'sounds like Alessandra' but is willing to take the Italian version if necessary.

'de' means 'of' in Spanish.

Burgos is presented as a town in Spain in period. (NDP)

**3 Alida de Conti** (F) - resub name Herald of Record:

Name was returned at Laurel in October of 2002 for lack of documentation of the given name.

She is resubmitting, with a photocopy of her driver's license as proof that 'Alida' is her mundane first name.

A 'Niccoló dé Conti' is found, dated to the 15th century, in a Funck & Wagnalls entry (PCA); There are also a variety of Popes whose original names were Conti or dé Conti: Rinaldo Conti in 1254, Lotario dé Conti in 1198, and Ugolino dé Conti in 1227. All these are from the online Catholic Encyclopedia, available at <a href="http://www.newadvent.org/cathen/">http://www.newadvent.org/cathen/</a> (PCA).

**4 Beyond the Mountain, Barony** - new order name & new device Herald of Record: Mary Sheahan Submitted Name: *Defender of the Oak* 


(Fieldless) On a chevron inverted azure, an annulet argent.

No documentation provided for the name.

The device will be returned, for violation of RfS VIII5:

The name Barony Beyond the Mountain was registered via the East in 1973.

There is a petition with signatures from seven officers including the baroness, but it only refers to 'this submission' without specifically mentioning the order name or badge. Since it does not list the specifics of which submission it refers to, as required by the Administrative Handbook (IV.C.5), it is invalid. Yes, we know that Laurel does not require a petition for this. Brigantia policy does. We will contact them for a valid petition if the submission is otherwise acceptable.



**5 Boal Mergen** (M) - new alternate name & new device Herald of Record: Sancha de Flores Submitted Name: *Basim al-Rami* 

Azure, eight arrows in annulo, points to center, argent.

Submitter will not accept major changes. If his name must be changed, he wants to retain the meaning 'the marksman'. He wishes his name to be made authentic for 'Arabic' language/culture.

The name construction is taken from Da'ud ibn Auda's "Arabic Naming Practices and Period Names List", at <u>http://www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/arabic-</u><u>naming.html</u>: It describes the use of an 'ism (a given name) and a lakab (an epithet).

The given name Basim is taken from a site called "Masculine Arabic Names", available at <u>http://www.sudairy.com/arabic/masc.html</u>;

Al-Rami is constructed to mean 'the marksman' or 'the archer', and 'Rami' can be found at the same site. Unfortunately this appears to be a baby name site.

The name 'Boal Mergen' was registered in January of 2003.

**6 Ding Li Ying** - new device Herald of Record: Sancha de Flores

Or, on a pile azure a lotus flower argent.

Name was accepted on the Eastern December 2002 Internal Letter of Intent, which has not yet been issued to Laurel.


**7 Edward the Staunch** (M) - new name Herald of Record: Eldritch


Submitter will not accept major changes, and if changes must be made, wishes the name to be appropriate for 15th century England.

Edward is the submitter's given name, but no proof is provided.

'Staunch' is presented as a descriptive byname from the OED, but no documentation is attached.

[We find 'Edward' in Withycombe, p. 94-95, SN: Edward.]





**8 Elizabeth Reed** - resub device Herald of Record: Margaret Holmwood

Or, a tyger statant to sinister reguardant, tail knowy azure, between four leaves in cross vert.

Previous device (*Or*, *a tyger statant reguardant, tail knowy azure, armed and langued and orbed argent, between four leaves in cross vert.*) returned in August 2002 for conflict with the East Kingdom Chronicler's badge (*Or, a tyger passant azure maintaining a quill argent.*) with but one CD for the addition of the leaves.

**9 Julian Ridley** - new name & new device Herald of Record: Aine Callaghan

Vert, a turtle tergiany plummetty argent and sable.

No changes.

Julian of Norwich lived from 1342-1416, according to 'Revelations of Divine Love' (NPCA).

Ridley is the submitter's mundane surname, as attested to by a photocopy of her driver's license.


**10 Lawrence Thornguard** - new household name & new badge Herald of Record: Eldritch Submitted Name: *House Thornguard* 


Gules, a chevron Or semy of wolf prints sable and overall a sword inverted.

No changes. No documentation provided, but 'Thornguard' is the submitter's surname, registered in May of 1987.

The household badge is on a device form, and will need to be transferred to a badge form.

[The sword is proper. (argent hilted Or)]





**11 Madelena Palmiere** (F) - new name & new device Herald of Record: Aine Callaghan

*Or, on a bend nebuly azure a feather bendwise argent.* 

If changes are required, the submitter is most concerned with an unspecified language/culture, presumably Italian.

'Madelena' from 'Italian Renaissance Women's Names' by Rhian Lyth of Black, found at <u>http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/rhian/italian.html</u> (NPCA).

'Palmiere' from 'Le Famiglie Di Firenze', vol. 2, p. 478 (PCA). This is in Italian but appears to date the name to 1387 and 1405.

**12 Medb ingen Muiredaich** (F) - new name Herald of Record: Sancha de Flores

The submitter wishes her name to be made authentic for pre-1200 Scotland.

'Medb' is from O'Corrain & Maguire, p. 135, "one of the twenty most popular names in later medieval Ireland. Medb, the headstrong queen of Connacht in the *Ta'in Bo' Cuailgne*. In the Christian tradition, one Medb of the Ciarraige was the mother of St Lugaid mac Luchta."

'ingen' is 'daughter of'.

'Muiredaich'is found in '100 Most Popular Men's Names in Early Medieval Ireland' at <u>http://www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/irish100.html</u>.

**13 Morgan Farraday** - new device Herald of Record: Brita Mairi Svensdottir

Argent, a lymphad, sails furled sable, in chief a cutlass argent on a chief sable dovetailed, a base nebuly azure.

Name registered as 'Morgan Faraday' in November of 1997.



**14 Mylisant Grey** - resub device Herald of Record: Marcus Blackaert


Per pale azure and Or, a thistle counterchangted.

Name passed Kingdom on the 2002-02 LoR, issued to Laurel on 24 November 2002, decided at Laurel in March 2003, the results of which have not yet been released.

Device (*Per chevron purpure and vert, a thistle slipped and leaved Or.*) was returned on the internal letter for conflict with Ansteorra's Order of the Sable Thistle of Ansteorra (*A blue thistle sable, slipped and leaved Or*) with but one CD for the fieldlessness of Ansteorra's badge.







**15 Richard le Hauke** (M) - new name & new device Herald of Record: Harold von Auerbach

Per pale azure and sable, a sword inverted palewise between two hawks close addorsed argent.

Richard is documented from Richard I of England, 1157-1199 (NDP).

'Hauke' is mentioned in a letter from the Academy of S. Gabriel (#953, PCA) but it appears to possibly be a typo for 'Hawke', which is dated to 1379. 'Hauke' is also mentioned as a Middle English word meaning 'nook or corner' in another S. Gabriel letter (#1633, PCA) but the letter does not speak to its suitability as a name.

**16 Sichelgaita Von Halsstern** (F) - resub name & resub device Herald of Record: Duncan Von Halstern

*Per bend purpure and Or, a harp counterchanged and in sinister chief a mullet of five Or.* 

Name and device returned sometime previous to the current Eastern Crown's tenure. No major changes, and if the name must be changed, the submitter would prefer to retain the sound. She also wishes her name to be made authentic for an unspecified language/culture (likely German).

'Sichelgaita' from numerous sources: Sichelgaita was a princess of Lombardy, dated to 1090, the wife of Robert Guiscard (from "Medieval Europe, A Short History", PCA). The rest of the references to 'Sichelgaita' appear to be from a variety of geneaology web pages whoch are not quoted here.

'Halstern' is mentioned on what appears to be a printout of a web page in some Scandinavian language which I cannot read (PCA, but no URL provided). It's also mentioned as a place of birth for someone born in 1690 on yet another genealogical web site (PCA).

**17 Silvia Wilkinson** - resub device Herald of Record: Margaret Holmwood

Azure, a fess wreathed Or and gules between six roses Or.

Previous device (*Azure, a fess wreathed between six roses Or.*) returned on 9/02 Internal LoR for having only a single tincture on the wreathed fess.
