
'Ívarr' - ibid, p 12. col. 1. Patronymic formed according to instructions on p 17 (-rr becomes -rs)



Gules, a dance between three lozenges argent




55 Triona Mac Caskty (F) - new name & new device Herald of Record: Jeanne Marie Lacroix

Per bend sinister sable and vert, a winged stag segeant, contourny, Or.

Tristram-Found in Black, s.n. Trisram; varent of Tristannas, dated to 1200.

Deans-header form in Black, says 'common in the district about Hawick in the 16th century' as Deans.
