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Greetings and Commendations unto the Herald and Pursuivants of the East Kingdom from Lyle Fitz William, EasternCrownHerald

This is the Letter of Report (LOR) on Internal Letter of Intent (LoI) number 2000-03. Accepted submissions listed in this letter have been sent to Blue Tyger Herald, to be included in an External Letter of Intent (XLor) to Laure� and the College of Arms.

Note 1: The date of this letter does not reflect the actual date of decision for these submissions.

Note 2: The number on this report does not match the numbering of the original LoI.

In Service,

1. Altheia Fenwick of Clan Campbell - new name change accepted & new device accepted

Quarterly, vert and sable, a sun in splendor argent.

Device is clear of Geneva of Estolat - Azure, estoile, a sun argent. (June 1975). Cannot be cleared by X2, since only the field is changing. One CD for the field, and one for the semy of estoiles (addition of secondary charge). Device may conflict with Aelhwiine Denedom Quarter, vert and sable, a mullet of four points through a sun argent. It was noted that in the precedent of Bruce Dracoranius of Mistholme, here references a precedent (LoARD Dec 89, p30) granting a CD between a mullet of four points and a compass star, though none between suns and multi-pointed mullets. (Friedrich von Rabenstein on the June 1993 LoAR, p 18) There is also a precedent in De' ud2 that says "...there is...[a CD] for the difference between a mullet of four points and a compass star." We could argue, therefore, that this is only a 'clear difference' and not a 'substantial' change, therefore, it does not clearly X2. Thus, it would bounce on the lack of a second CD. I will leave it to Laure� to decide if this is a correct call.

2. Alexandria Tigredel Castillo - new name accepted & new device accepted

Azure, a winged natural tigress anter-crafty argent, on a base Or, a castileable.

Not particularly great style for the device, and may contain two "weirdnesses" (winged, natural, double-headed). Name is marked "nomajor changes" - forwarding to Laure� for decision on gender of epithet "elite".

3. Alexander the Traveller - new name accepted

Per pale vert and Or.

Devices with primary charges clearly X, automatically. That leaves devices with no charges, or with peripheral charges only. No conflicts were found.

4. Andreale Lapin - new name accepted & new device accepted

Azure, arbor bitrampant maintaining a mace, a chief en bâton chargé of three dexter gauges.

Forwarding to Laure� for decision on gender of epithet.

5. Angus Kerr - new name accepted & new device accepted

Or, aspearable.

6. Antonio Bonetti - new name accepted & new device returned

Sable, on a pile argent a sword inverted gules; the hilts between three crescents one and two azur. (Badge: Morgan MacNeil of Clan Fergus - Aug '82) ICD (maximum) for the change to tertiary charges.

7. Asade Tenet - new device accepted

Per chevron sable and a dexter, two plates each charged with a mullet of seven points inverted throughout and in base, alion' shea debossed sable.

8. Astrid Olafsdatter - new name accepted & new device accepted

Vert, four weaver's stables bendwise in cross argent.

Butesee "Tik-AstridOlafsdottir"

9. Brighidh geni Gobhainn - new name accepted & new device accepted

Argent, abends in stirrups, between a cat's head couped sable and a thistle proper.

Formerly "Scott" name, not "Scottish" name. However, I assume that Scottish Gaelic is intended. For the requested time period (10th century), "ingenii" is more appropriate ("n" is post-period). This was actually a new device submission.

10. Brigid O'Neill the Limner - new name accepted & new device accepted

Gules, three bees simpall heads to center proper within a bordure embattled Or.

Use of a daimain name was not submitted. Accepted as "O'Neill", anglicized form of his name.

27. JerrroltBischler - new name accepted

 Familiennamen, p.77oftheA-Jsection, hasBaschlerasahreader, citingfrom1281de
 Baschler, also.

- 28. KenewarddeMusgrae** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Argent, on a pale between two mullets sanguine, three mullets of our point sargent.
 Keneward is documented spelling in W/Withycombe from 1086.de Musgrae is a documented spelling R&W from 1362. Ensuresubmitterknowsthat "Musgrave" is pronounced like "Musgrave", rather than rhyming with "thuscow".
- 29. KirstenWeisel** - new name accepted
 Kirsten listed in "Medieval German Given Names from Silesia" [LaurelPage]. Weisel-Brechenmacher, p.778 of section K-Z, under the header Weissel (that's actually an estset), lists Nikolai Weissli (against 'sanestset') to 1406.
- 30. LachlannmacLochlainn** - new name accepted & new badge accepted
(Fieldless) Two spears in saltire overall, a wolf's head erased sargent.
 Badgewould normally be returned for having an overall charge in field less armory (RF VIII.5). However, there is precedent per Bruce Draconarius, [5 January Cover Letter]: "I've...decided not to implement a comprehensive ban on field less badges with overall charges. I will be returning cases where the underlying charge is rendered identifiable, per Rule VIII.3; this will include themost egregious cases of overall charges (e.g. A pheasant mounted by a hawk's head). But this can be done as an interpretation of the current rules, and needn't involve an evp policy. In cases where identifiability is maintained — where one of the charges is along, slender object, and the area of intersection small — overall charges will still be permitted in field less badges."
- I will leave it to Laurelin to make a final decision on this submission.
- 31. MichaelAcrensis** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Gules, on a bend sinister between two crosses of Jerusalem sargent, three crescents palewise segules.
 This should perhaps be "Michaelis Acrensis" or "Michaeld'Acre".
- 32. MurieldeChimay** - resub device accepted
Per pale azure and vert, in pale three swans naiant sargent.
 Name was registered August 1998, via the East.
- 33. RhiannonverchTeganGlascoid** - resub badge accepted
Vert scalloped, abordure in veined Or.
 Nameregisteredas "Rhiannonverch Tegan Glascoed" in August of 1995 via the East.
- 34. RhysofRavenhill** - new name accepted & new device accepted
 Submitted as *Quarterly vert and argent, a raven contourny sable, sustaining a grenade proper.*
 RhysinWithycombe(p253).Ravenhill is a Canton of the SCA(East 8301).
 Thedeviceis problematic. First off, the grenade is not sustained, it is quite definitely maintained. Thus this is *Quarterly vert and argent, a raven contourny sable, maintaining a grenade proper.* Checking the accompanying sketch from the Pennsic worksheet appears to indicate that the grenade is maintained, rather than sustained.
- 35. RollandIanMacpherson** - new name accepted & new device returned
Per chevron azure and lozengy argent and sable, in chief two horses combattant sargent.
 Conflict with Colin McKenzie (East 3/99)
Per bend sinister sable and vert, a horse salient and another salient contourny sargent. One for the field. The move is forced by the field, and does not count. Salient and rampant conflict.
- 36. RosadaMurano** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Barry wavy Or and azure seme of roses Or.
 Murano—Ns suburb of Venice Italy, on 5 small islands in the Lagoon of Venice, noted for its medieval bascillit and forthemanufacture of Venetian glass in the late 13th C. p. 778, Merriam Webster's Geographical Dictionary, 3rd Edition.
- 37. RoseMaryGoodheart** - resub device accepted
Sable, on a bend or charged with a rose branch with rose and leaves sprooper and abordure argent.
 Name was registered October 1998, via the East.
- 38. SerenaTerranova** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Per fess purpure and sargent, above a volant argent and a cluster of grapes purpure,
 Name was registered August 1998, via the East.

- 43. VitaliaSoleil** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Or, on a fess between two mullets a crocodile leaping.
- 39. ShajartheDancer** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Purple, on a fess between two mullets a crocodile leaping.
- Name accepted as "ShajartheDancer". "ShajartheStarDancer" is unsupported (the fact that "MorganStarDancer" (Athenveid#8208) has been registered is noted in documentation).
- 40. SolveigAnderhalfholt** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Persalire verbandsable, three lions passant in annulo Or.
- Name accepted, but should be passed to Laurel with the note, "Does the combination of a Norse given name and a 14th-C. German surname make sense?"
- Device may conflict with Rand the Silversmith (#1271), who bears: "Sable, three African leopards passant in annulo proper." Noticeably X2. One CD for the change of field. What color is an African leopard proper? This will require rechecking the Laurel files.
- 41. SymondHarleyOLlynCelyn** - new name accepted & new device returned
Gyronny of five issuant from the sinister chief point in azure and argent, a hare sejant dexter foreleg raised proper.
- This name is marked as feminine, but Withycombe (2nd ed., p.258) notes Symond (under Simon) as exclusively male and dates the name to 1394. Harley (R.W.3.3(dedp217)) is dated to 1379 in Yorkshire. This would seem to make a Welsh-style locative unlikely. Assuming the locative "is Welsh", the "O" should be lower case, and probably causes confusion, giving "o'LynCelyn". While the combination is unlikely, I will leave it to Laurel to make a judgment call in this case.
- The device submission is problematic. It is submitted as gyronny of five...azure and argent... but is more properly blazoned Azure, two piles inverted (l'point) issuant from sinister chief argent... - in any case, the dominant tincture of the fields proper default to brown (see Glossary). Therefore, this is a colored chevron on a colored field, and must be returned for style/problems.
- 42. ThanaoftAngier** - new name accepted & new device returned
Azure a lotus blossom between in cross for a rostrum plume shaft to center, argent.
- Conflict with Gil mirror on the Blue Flame Azure, a globe amaranth flower/ Gomphrena globosa/argent. Once CD for the addition of secondaries. The lotus blossom apparently conflicts with an amaranth, as both fall under LOWER-MULTIPLIED in the SCA Ordinary.
- 43. WiltheinWisbram** - new device accepted
Per fess able and Or, a fess wavy argent and in chief a fesse Or.
- 45. AlejandraLuciadelaCastillo** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Or, two panthers combant [guardant] and on a point pointed a purple, a castle tangent.
- This is one of two standard depictions for panthers.
- 46. DavidGladstone** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Vert, a rose barbed and seeded between two rats rampant argent.
- 47. DianaScott** - resub device accepted
Vert, impaled a horse securant and a crescent and on a chief a fesse Or.
- 48. EoinMacNeillMacLochlainn** - new name accepted & new device accepted
Per pale a perch on inverted vizards azure and echies (slugs) embowed counter embowed respectant argent.
- Withycombe John 'pp.178-9; Sean' p.264, 'Eoin' p.104, give Scottish Gaelic forms Iain/ Ian and Irish forms Eoin, Mac Lyons at <http://www.MacNeill.info> and P. MacLochlainn [of the Ui Neill] under MacLoughlin.
- The second "Mac" needs to be in the genitive case: in modern orthography, that would be "Mac". I may need to be lenited also, giving "Mhic". Actually, given the fact that the double patronymic would appear to be nearly construction (and rare at that), it might be better to use earlier Gaelic spellings.
- Field division is a problem, with low contrast from non-standard quarterly field, partly obscured by changes Laurel decided on for whether this meets the same standards quarterly/persaltire.
- 49. OlgaKafshaiia** - new name accepted & new device returned
Gyronny wavy of six argent and azure, a dragonfly vert.
- Name composition follows Form IV in "Locative Bynames in Medieval Russia" [Laurel Page]; Kafkai is in the Crimean dialect to 1261. Device conflicts with Katerina Drachenklave (East 11/97); Barryway azur and argent, a dragonfly vert" with LCD for the field.

50. SabinadeLyons - new name accepted & new badge returned

Gules, a lion's head caboshed argent.

Withycombe, 260 'Sabin(a)', Latin 1199-1215; 'Lyons' in MWG Dp. 679 dates from Roman times, and in D. Matthews' 'Atlas of Medieval Europe', various entries.

Badge conflicts with Alonso of the Peacemakers (East 8105) "Gyronny Or and gules, a white tiger's head caboshed proper [Felix Tigris]"; 1 CD for the field. Also conflicts with Victoria Faine Dubonne (bears: "Tierced per pale azure, gules, and Or, a lion's head cabossed argent." One for the field.
