Authenticity requested for Swedish Viking.

Álfr is a masculine Old Norse given name as found in Geirr Bassi p. 8

inn Tivedens is a Old Norse byname referencing the Old Swedish *Tiveden*, a forest in Sweden known by 400-500 CE as found in "The Primeval Antiquities of Denmark: Third Division" by Jens Jacob Asmussen Worsaae p. 146 <https://en.wikisource.org/wiki/The_Primeval_Antiquities_of_Denmark/Third_Division> (see attached).

The submitter has requested authenticity for "Swedish Viking". We ask for the assistance of the College in meeting this request.

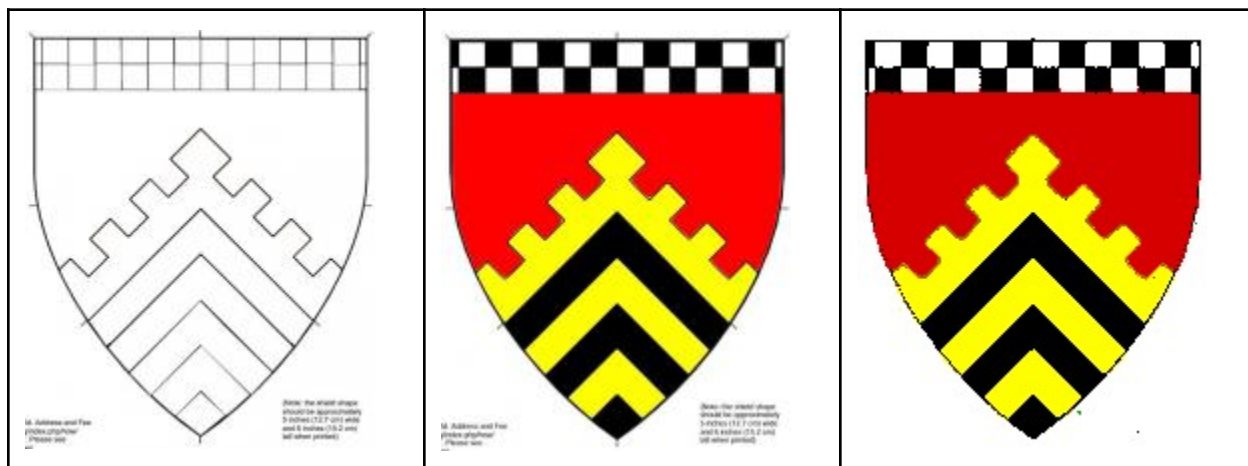
Submitted as *Álfr inn Tivedens*, the byname is not correctly formed for Old Norse, Old Swedish, or the lingua Societatis versions of such. *Tiveden* is the modern spelling of this Swedish forest and the preposition *inn* is Old Norse for ‘the’, used commonly with Old Norse nicknames, not locatives.

Kingdom commentary, following stated preferences, was able to construct the fully Old Norse version of this locative, *í Tivaviði*. This and the lingua Societatis version of this byname was offered to the submitter, who has chosen to change the name to *Álfr of Tiveden* to allow it to be forwarded.

In light of this choice, the submitter has agreed to drop the authenticity request for “Swedish Viking”. Precedent states that use of SENA PN1B2c: Lingua Societatis Allowance precludes authenticity: “The locative byname *of Maghas* is lingua Societatis; while registerable, such names are not authentic.” [Alde of Maghas, 2022/03, A-Lochac].

This device was withdrawn after the closure of the internal letter to fix the coloration of the counter-componey chief. During the internal decision period, it was discovered that when the device art was re-created to fix device outline issues with the form, the chief was colored in as black and white instead of black and yellow. While the initial redraw had been approved, it has now been confirmed that this was not what the submitter intended to submit. Therefore Kingdom withdraws this item and will place the correctly colored submission onto the next available internal letter to allow for proper commentary.

Therefore there is no difference for the type of bird being used, and that is the only other possible difference.

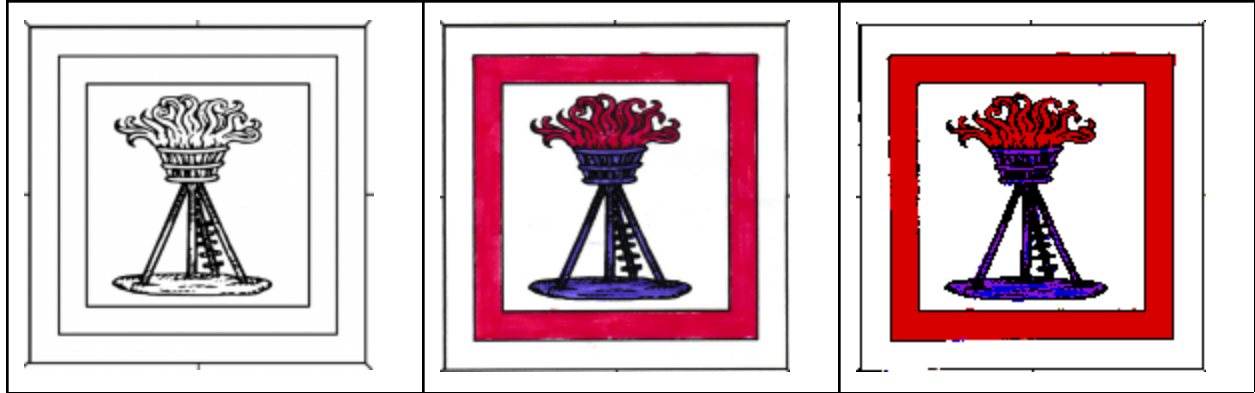

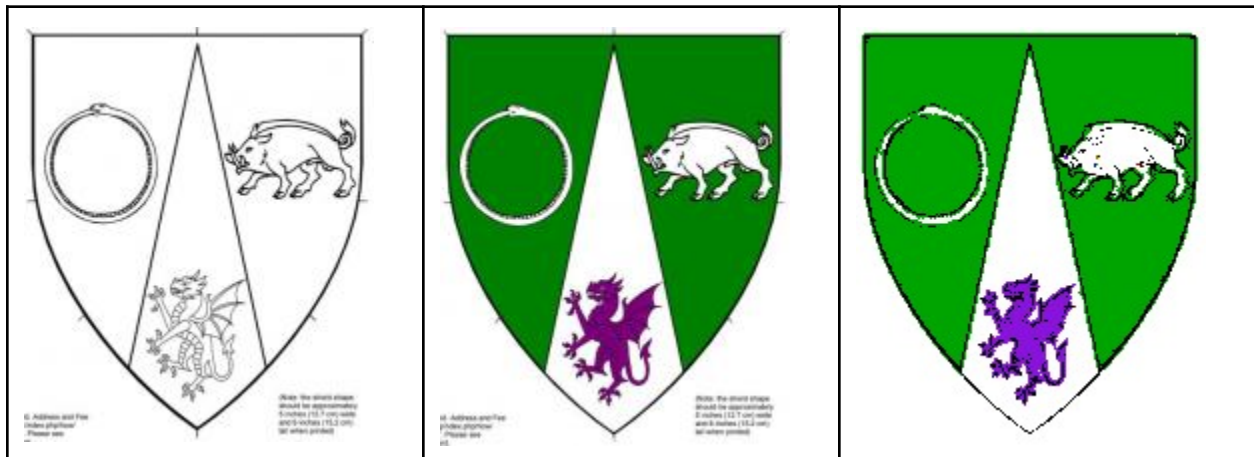

Kingdom commentary brought up a potential conflict with the registered name *Elizabeth le Grace*. Most commenters and Kingdom believe there is a possibility that these could be clear by SENA PN3C2: Substantial Change to the Sound of One Syllable and PN3C4: Changes to the Appearance of Multiple Letters, with a difference in sound and appearance between the *-is* syllable in *Gris* and the *-ace* syllable in *Grace*. Therefore, this is forwarded for Society review.

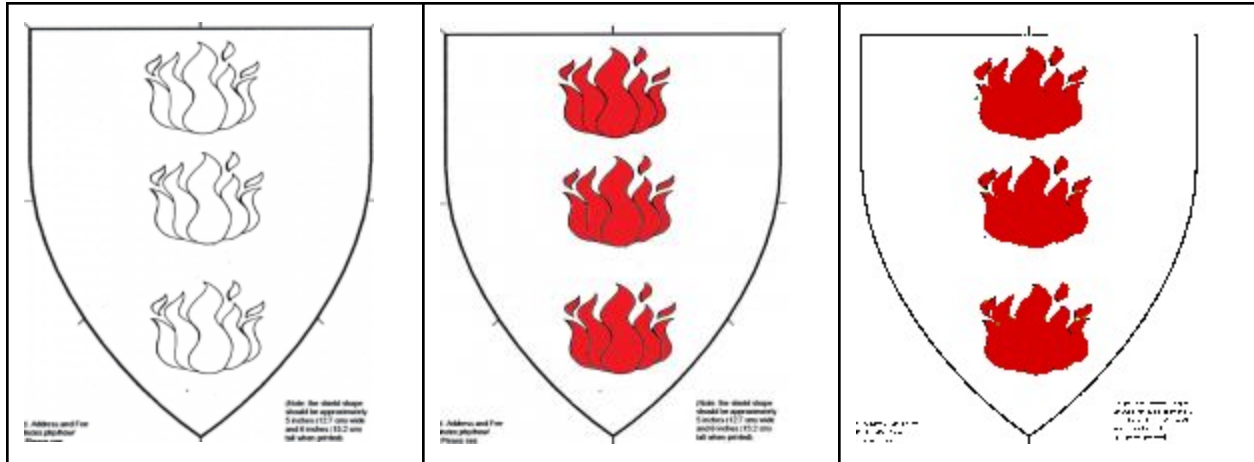

This is the second resubmission. Device attempt #1, *Argent, a pole cannon sable enflamed proper*, was returned on the May 2024 Letter of Acceptances and Returns with the following explanation:

This device is returned for conflict with the Barony of the Flaming Gryphon's badge for the Order of the Flaming Brand, Ermine, a torch sable, enflamed proper, and with the device of Vladimir Carpatii, Argent, a torch sable, fired gules within an orle vert. As there is no evidence of the pole-cannon in period armory, we must judge the difference between the two on appearance, and we do not believe there is sufficient visual difference between a pole-cannon and a torch, both poles with fire at one end, to be worth a DC. Against the Flaming Gryphon that leaves only a single DC for changing the field tincture, and against Vladimir, a single DC for removing the orle.

Device attempt #2, *Argent, a pole-cannon bendwise sinister sable enflamed proper*, was returned on the East Kingdom May 2025 Letter of Decision for conflict with the device of Martin the Juggler: *Argent, a torch bendwise sinister sable, enflamed proper, grasped by a hand bendwise sable*.

Orion is a male given name found in Wickenden's *Dictionary of Period Russian Names* s.n. Orion dated to the 14th Century.

Sokol is a byname also found in Wickenden s.n. Sokol, dated to 1495.

The submitter would prefer the name **Orion Hyacint Sokol** if it can be documented. We were unable to do so at the table.

Submitted as *Orion Sokol*, the submitter requested that the name be changed to *Orion Hyacint Sokol* if *Hyacint* could be documented. Kingdom commentary was able to source appropriate documentation to make this change, and therefore the name will be forwarded as requested.

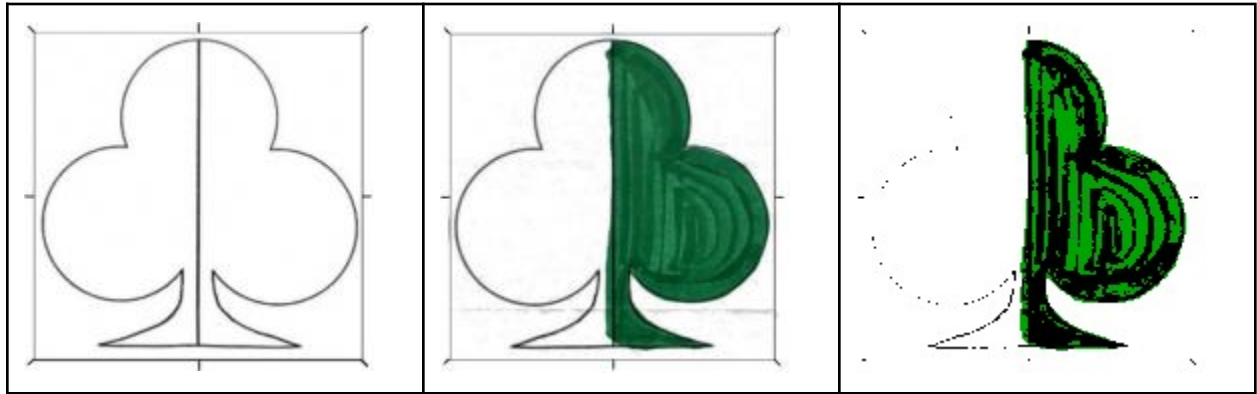

Please either provide documentation or use a known period depiction of a shamrock or trefoil if this charge is used in the resubmission.

The submitter has flipped the tinctures, clearing the above conflict.

The submitter has not provided additional document for the use of the above depiction of a shamrock or trefoil. We request the assistance of the Kingdom College to see if this can be found.

The submitter initially provided only the documentation that the name "the Traveler" was "SCA compatible". Per current precedent: "...We hereby rule that Traveler, or another period spelling of the term, is no longer considered SCA-compatible, but is registerable as a constructed byname..." [Sylverstone Traveller, 2021-01, A-An Tir]. Therefore, Blue Tyger has adjusted the documentation accordingly.

Notes:

Kingdom would like to remind submitters and those working with them that per current precedent, the concept of SCA-compatible names has ceased to exist and therefore is not valid documentation. Name documentation must show that the name could plausibly exist pre-1600 as a name in that role and spelling. Please review SENA PN1B2 on the ways this can be achieved with the proper support.

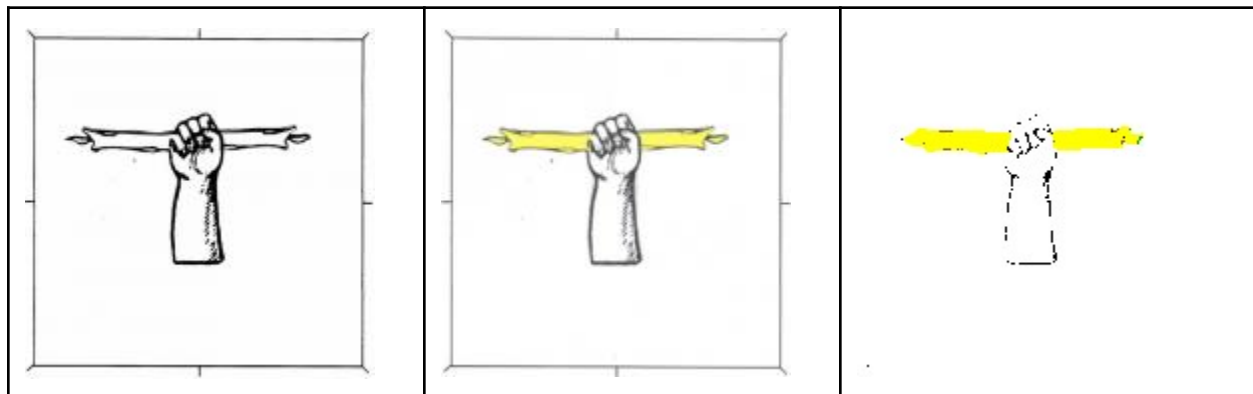

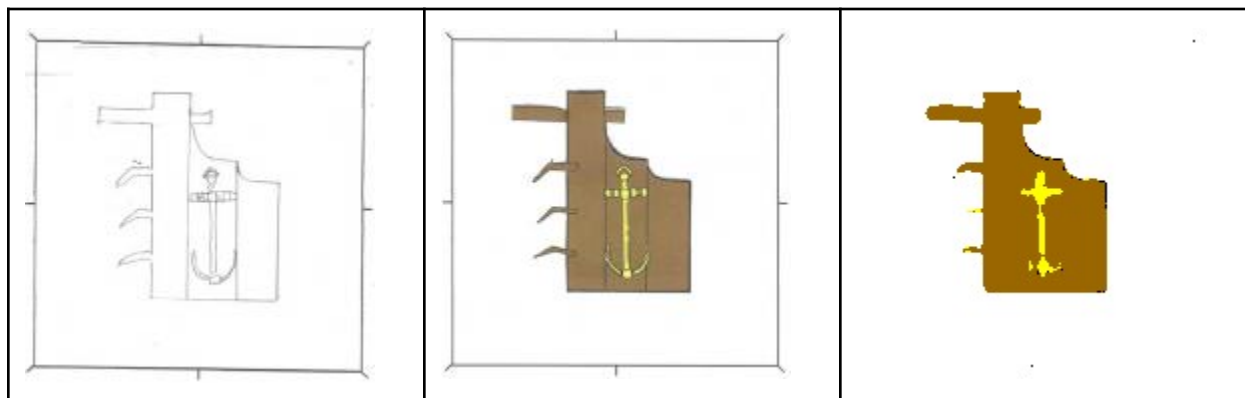

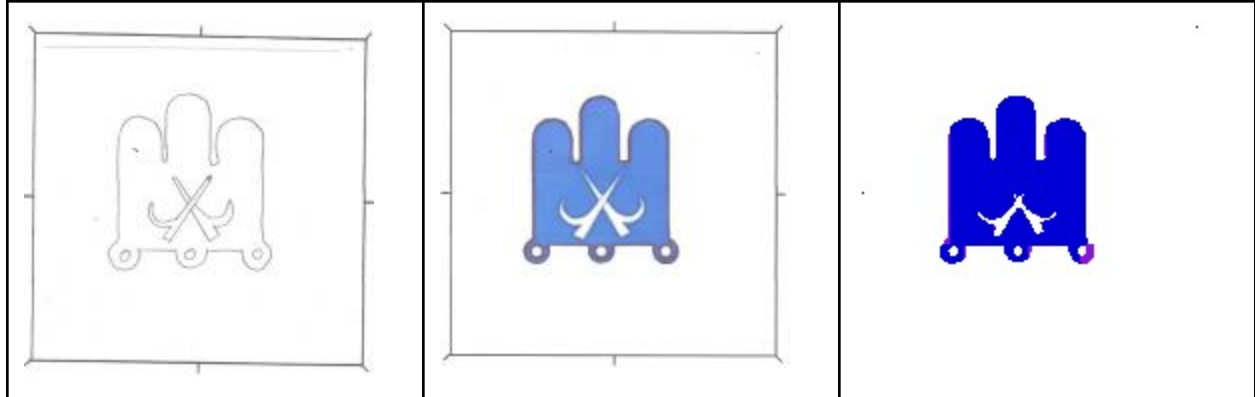

Kingdom commentary noted that, on reviewing the primary document in FamilySearch, there is a high likelihood that *Sinith* is a misprint of the common English surname *Smith*. A number of close alternatives were offered by commentary and presented to the submitter, who did not respond in time for the publication of this letter. Therefore, Kingdom chooses to forward the name as is, giving the submitter the benefit of the doubt as the batch used is a noted usable FamilySearch batch.
